Eco Insights: Environment CSP

What is the FL Wildlife Corridor?

It is ~18 million acres of connected wilderness and working lands that are critical for the survival of wild animals, many of which are endangered such as the FL Panther and Gopher Tortoise.



The corridor starts in the Everglades, going up both coasts allowing wild animals to roam natural habitat and keep gene pools healthy.

The FL legislature in 2021 unanimously passed the Wildlife Corridor Act to protect the needed land to for the entire corridor.

Besides protecting animals, keeping the corridor open protects land that helps lessen flooding, and preserves beautiful spaces for human recreation.

When land is purchased as part of the corridor, it keeps developers out for good.

The corridor protects important FL industries such as ranching and fishing. Florida's drinking water is protected via Everglades headwaters that bring clean water into springs and reservoirs.

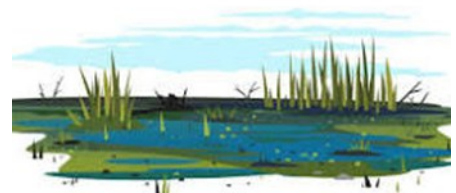

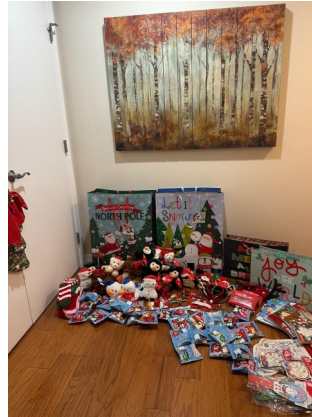
I would like to thank you for the privilege of being corresponding secretary. I am happy to send cards to friends and members at SPWC letting them know we care and support them.

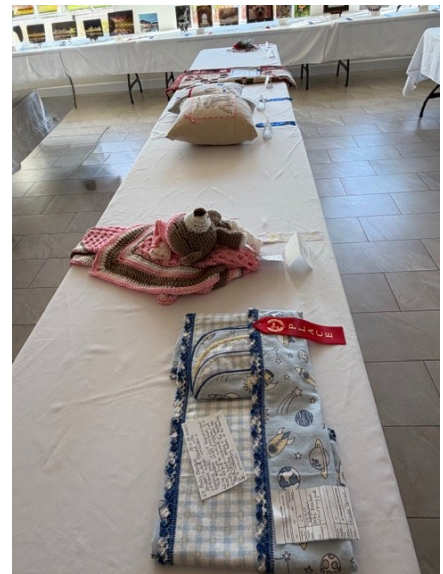
